

We received a total of 202 responses from pupils across our School, which gives a 55% response rate of all children in the school. To complete this survey, all of the children in Key Stage 2 were asked and a small selection of 6 children in each of the Reception and Key Stage 1 classes.

"My school helps me to be a great learner who is proud of their actions and believes that we can live in a happy community!"


I am Proud to Attend My School



We are delighted that 95% of our students are proud to attend Warberry




I feel listened to and have a voice in my class and my school community?




Do the school values help you to understand how to live together as a school


Does your teacher help you when you find things hard?

"Respect helps me to help my friend"


My teacher(s) knows me and understands how I learn

"I like to ask questions because it helps me understand things which makes me want to learn more about it."


What are you proud of achieving in class / school this year?

92% of students agreed that they have a wide range of opportunities to learn about different subjects,




Given a chance, what is the one change that you would like to see in your school or class?


- "I'd like to expand the book corner"

Do you think that the school provides you with enough sports / musical opportunities?




As well as our weekly PE lessons, we are proud to work alongside Torquay United Community Sports Trust and Kinetic to offer after school and lunch time sports clubs with a range available including football, cricket and tag rugby. We also have clubs with Saints Southwest in basketball and handball.

In addition to our long established KS2 choir, we are introducing a new KS1 choir in the last half term of this year and have peripatetic music lessons available for guitar, ukulele, piano, keyboard and drums.





In my class there are clear expectations for behaviour and it's fair




89% of students believe there are clear and fair expectations for behaviour. We have introduced a new behaviour policy this year and are already seeing the positive impact this is having

I know how to keep myself safe online



97% of pupils responded positively to this question; online safety is a core part of our safeguarding curriculum and something we discuss frequently, in an age-appropriate manner, with all of the children.

If I told someone at school I was worried about something they would help me



91% of pupils believe there is someone to help them if they are worried about something, lots of children referenced their teacher and many talked about having a friend they can talk to.

"One of the values that we follow is responsibility and I think responsibility helps with taking the blame for the things you did wrong. I also think respect helps everybody be kinder to each other"

Your school is part of a family of schools. What sort of things would you like to be able to do with other schools in our Trust?

Lots of our children really enjoy the opportunity to meet with members of our Trust family and responded with ideas such as:

- Group school trips
- Competitions
- · Sports and games days
- Music events
- Picnic
- Joint residentials
- Termly lunch meeting
- Visit the other schools more often
